UG CBCS: NEED of the HOUR, BUT...

In the recent few years a number of experiments have been made in Higher Education in India as well as in Assam, but the outcome of such changes and experiences are still in the form of speculation. Recently, Gauhati University has passed an order to implement CBCS system in the Undergraduate Level in the colleges affiliated to it from the session 2019-20. There is no denying the fact that CBCS opens up many opportunities for the students, where they can choose their subjects at their own will crossing even the border of stream.

But considering the present infrastructure and faculty strength, the UG colleges of Assam, especially in the rural and sub-urban colleges, the sudden implementation of such a system seems to be a white elephant. Like the introduction of Semester System in the UG level in 2011, the average students are neither enthusiastic about the CBCS, nor reactive against it; they are rather totally indifferent to any changes made in Higher Education. Therefore, the University and the Govt. should ensure the pre-requisites of the UG colleges, before imposing any new system upon their shoulder; otherwise, everything will be a mere Frankenstein.
